Overall national winner(s) will also receive a class trip to a local science venue.

Ten regional winners will each receive an Amazon voucher worth £25.

Highly commended certificates will also be awarded.

BOOKS MATTER

CHILDREN WHO OWN BOOKS ARE SIX TIMES MORE LIKELY TO READ ABOVE THE EXPECTED LEVEL FOR THEIR AGE.



An analysis from the National Literacy Trust Charity calculates that more than 380,000 children in the UK do not have a book of their own, which can affect their reading skills, enjoyment and wellbeing. The survey, of more than 56,000 children, reveals that 22% of children who own books read above the expected level, compared to just 3.6% of pupils who do not have a book. More than half (56.2%) of young people who have books enjoy reading, compared to less than a fifth (18.4%) of those who do not, according to the survey of pupils aged 9 to 18.
